Category	Description	Minimum Age	
Cat. C1	Entitles you to drive any vehicle up to 7.5 tonnes including a trailer up to 750Kgs	18 years old	
Cat. C1+E	Entitles you to drive any vehicle up to 7.5 tonnes with a trailer over 750Kgs	18 years old	
Cat. C	Also known as Class 2, this entitles you to drive a rigid vehicle over 7.5 tonnes	21 years old	
Cat. C+E	Also known as Class 1, this entitles you to drive a rigid or articulated vehicle over 7.5 tonnes with a trailer over 750Kgs. Note: You need to have a Cat. C licence in order to take this course.	21 years old	



## A Guide to obtaining your LGV Licence

1. Provisional LGV entitlement must be obtained prior to an ON ROAD assessment or driving tuition can commence. To obtain this follow the procedure below:
  - a) Contact a doctor and arrange for an appointment for a medical examination. They will complete the Medical Form D4.
  - b) Complete the Application for Provisional Licence Form D2.
  - c) Send all the items required in an envelope addressed to:

Driver & Vehicle Licencing Agency,  
Swansea

  - d) DVLA will normally reply to your application after approximately two to three weeks, by returning your new photocard licence and paper counterpart to include your provisional LGV licence entitlement. If there is a long delay contact the DVLA on 0870 240 0009.
2. On receipt of your licence, contact us immediately to arrange a **FREE ON-ROAD assessment** with no obligation.
3. You will then need to do an LGV theory test which either we or you can book. You will need resources to learn from these being an LGV theory manual (£14.99) as well as a hazard perception DVD (£15.99). These can be purchased wither from us duremently, over the phone or from a good book shop.
4. Once you have passed your theory test, you can then book your training. Simply contact the office on:
